Ibababa pa ng Department of Agriculture (DA) ang presyo ng bigas na ibinibenta sa “Rice-for-All” Program ngayong buwan.

Mas lalo pang pinababa ang presyo ng bigas sa mga Kadiwa outlets.. Samantala, hinimok ng isang mambabatas ang Department of Agriculture na paigtingin ang inspeksyon laban sa mga nananamantala sa presyo ng bigas.

Ayon kay DA Assistant Secretary and spokesperson Arnel de Mesa, mula sa kasalukuyang P40 kada kilo na bigas sa piling lugar ng Kadiwa sa Metro Manila, gagawin na itong P38 hanggang P39 kada kilo.

“Nagsimula tayo diyan, nagbenta tayo ng P45 per kilo naibaba iyan sa P43.00 at P42.00 at nito nga bago matapos ang taong 2024 ay naibaba pa iyan sa P40.00 per kilo,” pahayag ni De Mesa.

Ayon kay De Mesa ito ay dahil sa ilulunsad na rin ng DA ang “Sulit Rice” at “Nutri Rice” programs sa Metro Manila.

CALAMBA CITY, Laguna (PIA) – The Philippine National Police (PNP) will ‘run after’ sources of fake news or disinformation to safeguard the integrity and manage the flow of accurate information to the public during the 2025 National and Local Elections.

Police lieutenant general Robert Rodriguez, Commander of the Special Task Force for the 2025 Elections said that the police forces are tasked by PNP chief General Rommel Francisco Marbil to prevent the spread of fake news.

“One of the efforts done by the House is to investigate the vloggers. The PNP is also doing that. If there are reports that an individual is purposely creating fake news, we will coordinate with the concerned agencies to take down their page,” Rodriguez said.

Through the PNP Anti-Cybercrime Group (ACG), the police are more equipped to combat cybercrime, fake news and disinformation to prevent any election-related violence and promote a secure voting environment.

PNP recognizes the increasing influence of disinformation in elections and their close coordination with social media companies allows them to properly investigate the sources of disinformation and possibly call for their account’s deactivation.

In a statement posted on Facebook, Marbil stressed that every effort is being made by the PNP to protect the integrity of the democratic process, avoid misinformation that could mislead voters, and ensure that the will of the

DA to lower Rice-for-All prices, MSRP for imported rice

The Department of Agriculture (DA) will reduce on Wednesday, February 12, rice prices under the KADIWA ng Pangulo’s Rice-for-All (RFA) program. The price reduction reflects both a drop in global rice prices and an increase in domestic supply as the local harvest season gets underway.

Agriculture Secretary Francisco P. Tiu Laurel Jr. said the RFA prices will be lowered by as much as P3 per kilo. Starting Wednesday, the agri chief said RFA5 rice will be priced at P43 per kilo, RFA25 at P35, and RFA100 at P33.

At present, RFA5—comprising rice with no more than 5% broken grains—is sold at P45 per kilo, RFA25 at P38 a kilo, and RFA100 at P36 per kilo. The KADIWA ng Pangulo program will continue to provide rice at P29 per kilo for vulnerable groups such as senior citizens, persons with disabilities, solo parents, and individuals from indigent sectors.

Although international rice prices have eased, Secretary Tiu Laurel reassured local farmers that the National Food Authority (NFA) will procure palay from local farms at a price of P21–P23 per kilo, ensuring fair compensation for their harvests. He said the NFA has sufficient funding to support farmers and uphold its mandated rice buffer stock, now equivalent to 15 days of national consumption under the revised Rice Tariffication Law.

CALAMBA CITY – Mayor Roseller “Ross” H. Rizal, together with the Calamba City Government, led the commemoration of the 80th anniversary of Doce de Pebrero today in Barangay Real.

During a solemn wreath-laying ceremony, officials and residents honored the sacrifice of 2,000 Calambeño men who lost their lives at the hands of Japanese forces during World War II. Their bravery, aimed at protecting their families and homeland, remains etched in the hearts of every Calambeño.

The Tragic History of Doce de Pebrero

On February 12, 1945, one of the darkest days in Calamba’s history unfolded as Japanese troops, in retaliation against Filipino resistance forces, carried out a brutal massacre. Around 2,000 Calambeño men were forcibly taken from their homes, rounded up, and executed. The massacre, known as Doce de Pebrero, was part of a larger wave of atrocities committed by the Japanese Imperial Army as they retreated in the final months of World War II.

Many of the victims were innocent civilians, including fathers, sons, and brothers, who were accused of aiding Filipino guerrillas. Entire families were left devastated, and the horrors of that day continue to be remembered as a painful yet significant chapter in the city’s history.

Honoring the Legacy

“Though our fellowmen suffered greatly, their courage serves as a lasting reminder of our unity and love for our country,” said Mayor Rizal.

For the past 80 years, Calamba has continued to honor the memory of those who perished through the annual Doce de Pebrero commemoration. This event not only serves as a tribute to the fallen but also as a reminder of the resilience and strength of the Calambeño spirit.

When business and love collide

Mylene and Bonifacio Alcazar are both life and business partners, venturing into multiple businesses while keeping their relationship stronger.

At 49 years old, Mylene Alcazar from Quezon Province has built a life defined by resilience, determination, and love. She has been married for 30 years to Bonifacio Alcazar.

Their story began when Mylene was 19 and Bonifacio was 21. At the time, she had dreams of pursuing a college degree, but those plans changed when they got married in 1992. Bonifacio, a farmer by trade, made farming their primary source of income. With the money they received from their wedding, they invested in three cows and three carabaos, which they bred to start a small livestock business. This humble beginning allowed them to build their first home, made of sawali and plywood.

Seeing the potential in expanding their income sources, Mylene ventured into pig farming, which proved to be another successful endeavor. The couple’s hard work paid off, and together, they raised three children. Their eldest now lives abroad with her own family, the second earned a degree in agriculture, and their youngest is pursuing a degree in hospitality management, currently in her fourth year of college.

In their vegetable garden, Mylene and Bonifacio grow eggplant, chili peppers, corn, string beans, and tomatoes. But farming, like any seasonal business, doesn’t provide a consistent daily income. Recognizing this, they opened a small sari-sari store in 2006 to supplement their earnings. That same year, Mylene became a client of CARD Bank, securing a PHP 5,000 loan to fund her store.

“When we fell short on capital, CARD Bank was there to help,” Mylene recalled. Over the years, she took out several loans, with the largest amounting to PHP 50,000, which she used to further grow her businesses.

In addition to her ventures, Mylene became a konek2CARD agent, facilitating transactions for fellow CARD Bank clients, including load purchases, withdrawals, and loan payments. “The branch and unit office is quite far from our area,” she explained. “If clients go there to withdraw, they end up spending around PHP 400 on round-trip fare. That’s why I became a konek2CARD agent—to help them save on transportation costs.”

Through her experience, Mylene has learned valuable financial lessons. “Whenever you take out a loan, make sure to use it wisely,” she advised. “That way, you won’t struggle with repayments, and you’ll maintain the trust of the institution.”

Looking ahead, Mylene is optimistic about the future. She hopes to further expand her sari-sari store, livestock business, and piggy while continuing to support her family and community.

“Success doesn’t come overnight,” she said. “But with hard work, dedication, and the right support, it’s possible.” PR

In Camarines Norte, army troops unearth a cache of NPA weapons and explosives

On Thursday, February 13, a cache of weapons and explosives belonging to the Communist Terrorist Group was found in Labo, Camarines Norte, thanks to information provided by a former NPA member. Together with the local police units in the area, troops from the Philippine Army's 2nd Infantry (Jungle Fighter) Division's 16th Infantry (Maglilingkod) Battalion responded to information about the terrorist group's hidden weapons and explosives in Barangay Baay of the aforementioned municipality.

Numerous powerful weapons and explosives, including four M16A1 rifles, one M14 rifle, and one M1 carbine, were found in the cache by the authorities. They also found five anti-personnel mines, seven improvised hand grenades, nine improvised switches, four rolls of detonating cords, fifty blasting caps, and five rolls of detonating cords.

"The recovery of these firearms not only weakens the terrorist group's capability to sow violence but also indicates the dwindling number of NPA fighters that explains the arms cache," said Major General Cerilo Balaoro Jr., Commander of the Army's 2ID covering Southern Tagalog and parts of Bicol.

"The discovery of these anti-personnel mines is alarming. These improvised explosives used by the NPA as weapons, are prohibited under the United Nations Anti-Personnel Mine Ban Convention and its presence in communities gravely endanger anybody particularly the civilian populace. Despite the risk posed by these illegal and indiscriminate explosives, our troops remain committed to protecting the Filipino people from such inhumane threat," added Maj. Gen. Balaoro.

He added that the successful operation also shows how the public is becoming more confident in the government's attempts to put an end to local communist armed strife and bring about enduring peace. Additionally, he exhorted the surviving NPA members to return to the folds of law enforcement and lead tranquil lives with their loved ones.

As you may remember, on January 9, soldiers from 161B also found an NPA weapons and explosives cache in Barangay Exciban, which is located in the same municipality. The cache included two (2) caliber.30 light machine guns, eight (different high-powered firearms, and a number of improvised explosive devices and accessories.

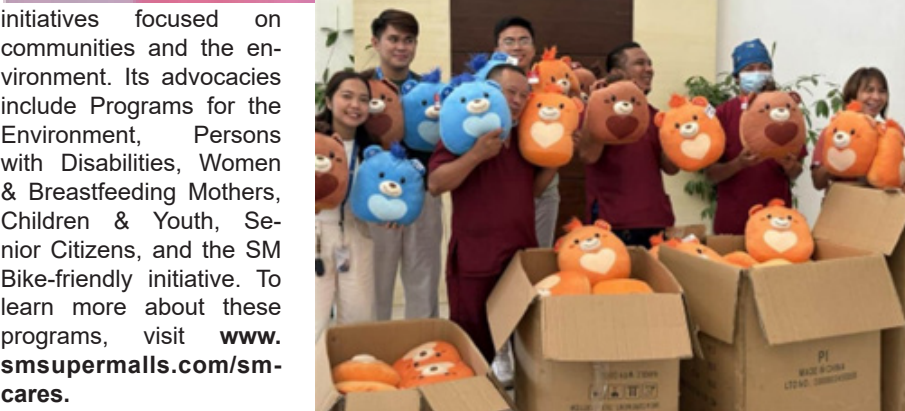
