Mas napalakas din ang pagbabantay at mas malinaw ang pananagutan ng mga pulis dahil sa CCTV integration.

Bahagi ito ng mas pinaigting na programa sa seguridad ni Governor Sol Aragon. Kabilang dito ang mas malawak na paggamit ng 911 emergency hotline, pagpapalawak ng drone-assisted surveillance sa ilalim ng Laguna Eye, at dagdag na CCTV

coverage sa iba't ibang lugar ng probinsya. Simula nang maupo ang Gobernadora, patuloy na bumababa ang naitatalang insidente ng krimen.

Upang ipakita ang bisa ng sistema, nag-sagawa ng biglaang drills ang kapulisan ng Laguna. Sa Calamba, nakarating ang mga pulis sa loob ng apat na minuto, habang sa Los Baños ay dalawang minuto lamang patunay na posible ang target na five-minute response sa aktuwal na sitwasyon.

BIR to conduct parallel audit, probe on anomalous flood control contractors

SAN PABLO CITY, Laguna (PIA) – Following President Ferdinand Marcos, Jr.'s orders to hold accountable contractors allegedly involved in anomalous flood control projects, the Bureau of Internal Revenue (BIR) has announced the conduct of parallel audit and investigation on unscrupulous contractors to determine irregularities in their tax liabilities.

In a recent online statement, BIR Commissioner Romeo Lumagui Jr. announced that the Bureau will conduct a parallel investigation into contractors involved in irregular flood control projects and emphasized that any contractors found to have underpaid or evaded taxes will not be issued an updated tax clearance by the BIR.

"I have ordered an immediate tax fraud audit against contractors involved in anomalous flood control projects. While the President's investigation is ongoing, the Bureau will conduct a parallel audit of their tax returns and payments," Commissioner said.

He added: "If tax underpayment or evasion is proven, they will be denied for an updated tax clearance, and have their contract settlement

Escudero, isinusulong ang 'negative list' para mapigilan ang mga walang kwentang proyekto ng DPWH

Hinimok ni Senate President Francis "Chiz" Escudero ang Malacañang na bumuo ng tinatawag na "negative list" o talaan ng mga proyektong pang-imprastruktura na hindi dapat pondohan sa ilalim ng pambansang badyet para sa 2026.

Ito aniya ay dapat agad na i-veto ni Pangulong Ferdinand Marcos Jr. dahil nagiging dahilan lamang ito ng pag-aaksaya ng pondo na mas kailangan sa mahahalagang programa.

Ayon sa senador, mas mainam na maging maagap at tukuyin na agad kung anu-anong proyekto ang hindi dapat isama sa budget kaysa hintayin pang makalusot ang mga kuwestiyonableng proyekto.

Aniya, babaha ng mga walang silbing proyekto kung hindi lilinawin kung alin ang dapat ipagbawal, at nararapat na walang ilaan na pondo para sa mga proyektong hindi naman nagbibigay ng benepisyo.

Kabilang sa mga iminungkahi niyang isama sa negative list ang mga mababang halaga ngunit labis na overpriced na kagamitan sa kalsada gaya ng reflective studs o "cat's eyes," slope protection nets at mga pintura.

Gayundin, dapat ding alisin ang mga tinawag niyang "vanity projects" gaya ng waiting sheds, swimming pools, signages at iba pang hindi pangunahing pangangailangan na madalas maging dahilan ng pang-aabuso at pag-aaksaya sa pondo.

Tinitingnan din ng Senate President ang posibilidad ng pagpapataw ng moratorium sa mga bagong flood control projects ng Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) para sa 2026, lalo't nananatiling hindi pa naipatutupad ang bilyon-bilyong pisong alokasyon sa ilalim ng badyet para sa 2025.

Binigyang-diin niya na dapat munang tapusin ang mga nakabibing proyekto at ayusin ang sistema bago ipagpatuloy ang mga ito, upang mabigyan ng pagkakataon si DPWH Secretary Dizon na ayusin muna ang pamamalakad.

Iminungkahi rin ni Escudero na ilaan ang pondo sa mas makabuluhang proyekto gaya ng waste-to-energy plants, refuse-derived fuel facilities at iba pang hakbang laban sa basura, baradong daluyan ng tubig at bumababang kapasidad ng mga ilog at daluyan na pangunahing dahilan ng pagbaha sa Metro Manila at iba pang lungsod.

Congressman Benjamin Agarao Jr., representative of Laguna's 4th District, has strongly denied bribery allegations hurled against him by contractor spouses Pacifico and Cezarah Discaya during a Senate Blue Ribbon Committee hearing on alleged corruption in flood-control projects.

In a statement released Monday September 8, 2025, Agarao firmly refuted the accusations:

"I categorically deny the allegations of The Spouses Discaya that I asked money from them in exchange for projects in my district in Laguna. HINDI PO YAN TOTOO.

WALA PO SILANG PROYECTO SA AKING DISTRITO."

The Discayas, in their sworn affidavit, had implicated several lawmakers and officials from the Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH), alleging that they were pressured to give "advance commissions" of up to 25% of project costs to secure infrastructure contracts.

Agarao's name appeared among those listed.

Visibly angered, Agarao declared his intent to take legal steps to defend his reputation:

"I am consulting my lawyers. I will sue them for libel and perjury. Hindi ko hahayaan na sirain nila ng ganun lang ang pangalan at reputasyon ko na iningatan ko ng mahabang panahon."

He underscored that the Discayas have no active projects in his district, questioning the credibility of their claims.

As the Senate probe continues, Agarao joins other officials who have pushed back against the Discayas' testimony. Legal experts predict a series of libel and perjury cases as those implicated move to protect their names.

WHY IS THE ONLY CHRISTIAN NATION IN ASIA SO CORRUPT?



A post has been making the rounds on Facebook asking why corruption is so rampant in the Philippines — the only Christian nation in Asia. It's a painful question, but one we can't dodge. We love to boast of churches packed every Sunday, of fiestas and novenas painting the streets with color, of processions and pilgrimages that display our devotion. And yet, year after year, we also rank among the most corrupt nations in the region. Faith is loud, but justice is silent.

The truth is, we Filipinos often wear religion like a festival mask — dazzling, colorful, spectacular — but beneath it lurks a darker face. Leaders kneel in church in the morning, then plunder in the afternoon. Chapels rise from stolen funds, bishops bless ribbon-cuttings, and beggars still wait outside, hand outstretched, while candles flicker and choirs sing inside.

Corruption is not an isolated vice here; it has sunk deep into our bloodstream. From the barangay captain handing out envelopes of cash to secure votes, to legislators gorging on pork barrels, to presidents toppling under scandal, corruption runs from the grassroots to Malacañang itself. It is not the exception; it is the habit of the nation.

But, in fairness, corruption is not uniquely ours. It is as old as humanity itself. Human nature is broken. Augustine called it "original sin" — meaning that we are born with a bent toward selfishness. Martin Luther went further, saying we are simul iustus et peccator — a Latin phrase that simply means: "at the same time righteous and a sinner." Even when God forgives us and calls us His own, we still wrestle with greed, lust, and pride. We can pray sincerely and still lie. We can kneel honestly and still steal. That tension is the human condition — and corruption is its most visible fruit. Other religions say the same in their own way. Islam warns of the nafs — the restless ego inside us that always wants more. Hindu epics are full of kings and warriors undone by greed for power. Buddhist and Confucian histories tell of dynasties collapsing because rulers lost their sense of virtue. The Philippines is not special in this weakness; it's part of being human.

Other Christian nations have also been riddled with corruption. Italy, Spain, Russia, Latin America — lands steeped in faith yet scarred by graft.

I look to Western Europe not as holier, but as a kind of reluctant beacon. Its integrity was not born of piety but of pain. Reformations shattered religious power, revolutions toppled monarchies, wars exposed the cost of arrogance, and national humiliations stripped away illusions. Out of that long, brutal schooling came systems — flawed, but real — that punish greed and reward fairness.

The bitter irony is: it was Christian values — honesty, justice, human dignity — that reshaped those societies, even as their churches grew emptier. Walk into a quiet chapel in Switzerland today and you may find only a handful praying. But step outside, and you will see hospitals that serve the sick, schools that shape citizens, and laws that hold leaders accountable.

Meanwhile, in the Philippines, the flood control projects scandal is just the newest proof that corruption isn't an exception — it's the rule. Money meant to protect poor families from floods was siphoned off into kickbacks and private accounts. Concrete meant for dikes hardened instead into the walls of private mansions. When even disasters be-

come business opportunities for thieves, what does that say about us?

This is the shameful contrast: empty pews in a just society are better than overflowing pews in a corrupt one. Better a quiet church in Europe, where pews may be bare but the poor are fed, than a jam-packed basilica in Manila where hymns roar to the rafters while politicians in the front pew smile like saints and beggars outside go hungry.

Because really — what good is incense if the air outside stinks of injustice? What good are hymns if they drown out the cries of the poor? What good is the Body of Christ on the altar if the body of the nation is already decomposing from corruption?

And this is where the blade must cut deeper: no amount of preaching will fix this unless the Church itself repents. Too often we have blessed dynasties, accepted donations from dirty hands, and cozied up to the powerful instead of standing with the powerless. When chapels are built with stolen money and priests shake hands with plunderers at fiestas, the Church is not confronting corruption — it is baptizing it. We cannot call the nation to repent unless we ourselves repent first.

So where do we begin? By letting the Gospel seep deeper — not just into our rituals, but into our conscience, our institutions, our politics. By forming schools that build integrity. By creating systems that force accountability. By preaching that convicts instead of entertains. By raising leaders — both political and religious — who lead by example.
